1. Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The sailing instructions will be on the official notice board at [KSSS Olympic Class Regatta 2026 - KSSS](#)
- 1.3 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.
- 1.4 RRS 40.1 will apply at all times while the boat is afloat and on the water. A boat breaking this rule may be warned or penalized at the discretion of the protest committee.
- 1.5 When the water temperature is below +14°C a competitor shall wear clothes that prevents from hypothermia, i.e., wetsuit or drysuit.

2. Eligibility

- 2.1 Each boat shall have a third-party liability insurance covering a minimum of 500,000 €, for when a boat and the person in charge is liable for serious damage or injury.
- 2.3 The person in charge, who is a Swedish citizen, shall have a competition license (Tävlingslicens) issued by the Swedish Sailing Federation.
- 2.4 Boats with ownership or registration in Russia or Belarus, or boats with competitors that are Russian or Belarusian citizens are not allowed to participate in the competition.

3. Entry

- 3.1 Boats may enter the event by registering online at Sailarena [KSSS Olympic Class Regatta 2026 - KSSS](#) not later than 14 September 2026.
- 3.2 Entry fee to be paid in connection with the entry:

Optimist, ILCA 4, IQFOiL Youth	450 SEK
Europe class, ILCA 6, ILCA 7, IQ & Formula -Foil, Waszp	650 SEK
RS Feva, 29er, 49er FX, 49er	1100 SEK
- 3.4 Late entry is possible until 30 September 2026 upon payment of an additional late entry fee of 300 SEK for single handed classes and 600 SEK for double handed classes.
- 3.5 The minimum number of entries for single handed classes are 12, and for double handed classes 8 to ensure a separate start group. If the number of entries does not reach the minimum number until 14 September 2026 the class/event may be cancelled by the Organizing Authority or combined with another class to form a start group. If the class/event is cancelled the entry fee will be refunded.

4. Registration and equipment inspection

- 4.1 Registration on site shall be made at the Race Office in KSSS Club House not later than 3 October 09:00.
- 4.2 The person in charge shall have club membership, competition license and valid measurement certificate or similar.
- 4.3 A boat, crew or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the rules. On the water the race committee or the technical committee may direct a boat to a specified site for inspection.
- 4.4 A competitor that has become ill or injured may be replaced after approval by the race committee. However, the person in charge may not be changed.

Prize giving ceremony

6. Format

6.1 The number of races for each class will be presented in the supplementary sailing instructions.

6.2 The event will consist of a series of races with all boats in the same class in the same fleet. A class with more than 50 boats may be divided into smaller fleets.

7. Venue and course

7.1 The racing area will be Baggensfjärden, Saltsjöbaden

7.2 The courses will be presented in the supplementary sailing instructions.

8. Protests and penalties

8.1 RRS appendix P will apply.

8.2 RRS T1 will apply

9. Scoring

9.1 RRS A2.1 is changed so that when three or fewer races have been completed, no score will be excluded.

9.2 The race committee will make no changes to the results 24 hours after the last race as provided for in RRS 90.3e.

10. Prizes

- 10.1 One prize per 5 boats, minimum 3 and maximum 10 prizes per class and more prizes can be awarded.

11. Support persons

- 11.1 Support and coach vessels shall be registered at the Race Office and a support vessel fee shall be paid at the race office or direct at the entry for support and coach vessels at ONB
- 11.2 Support person shall launch, berth and take up his vessel as directed by the organizer.
- 11.3 Support persons shall comply with NoR 1.4.
- 11.4 During the race, a support person shall not be closer to a competitor than 50 meters, except when the support person acts under RRS 1.1.

KSSS Sustainability

The Baltic Sea is one of the world's most sensitive marine environments.

Sailors, officials, and visitors all share a responsibility to protect the sea and its ecosystems. KSSS actively works to reduce the environmental impact of our events and cooperates with Voice of the Ocean to increase awareness, engagement, and concrete action for healthier seas.

Everyone involved in our events is expected to follow the guidelines below.

- **Prevent marine litter.** Keep areas clean both on board and ashore so that waste does not risk being blown into the water. Store all waste securely and dispose of it in designated containers. You are also expected to pick up litter that you see in or near the water and bring it ashore for proper handling. Deposit bottles and cans must be recycled by placing them in the correct recycling containers.
- **Avoid single-use plastics.** Plastic bags and other single-use plastic items should not be taken onto the water. Use reusable alternatives such as cloth bags, water bottles, and food containers.
- **Use environmentally friendly cleaning products.** Please refrain from using detergents or cleaning agents that may negatively affect water quality.
- **Reduce fuel consumption.** Turn off your engine when it is safe to do so, anchor instead of idling, and maintain a steady and moderate speed.
- **Handle fuel responsibly.** Fill tanks slowly, use absorbent pads to catch spills, avoid overfilling, and leave approximately ten percent empty space in the tank for fuel expansion. Ensure that engines and fuel systems are well maintained to prevent oil or fuel leakage.
