1. RULES

- 1.1 Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.
- 1.2 Scoring system
 - One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
 - When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her race scores.
 - When 5 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - When more than 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her race scores excluding her 2 worst score.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at <u>ONB</u>, <u>www.ksss.se/ksss-olympic-class-regatta</u>
- 3.2 The race office is located at KSSS Clubhouse in Saltsjöbaden, telephone 070-306 51 57, email raceoffice@ksss.se
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee communicates with coaches/supporters etc on VHF radio channel 72.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at flagpole next to the water close to Sjövillan
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Dates of racing

- 5.2 12 races are scheduled during the regatta.
- 5.3 The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 30 minutes to sail.

6 CLASS FLAGS

6.1 The class flag is White flag with 29er insignia.


7 RACING AREA

8 COURSES

- 8.1 The diagram shows the course, including the approximate angles between legs.
- 8.2 The order in which marks are to be passed: Start 1 4s/4b 1 4b Finish
- 8.3 If signalflagga T is displayed before or with the warning signal, the course will be sailed 3 times, in the following order:

Start - 1 - 4s/4b - 1 - 4s/4b - 1 - 4b - Finish



9 MARKS

9.1 The rounding marks are red.

The starting mark is a spar buoy with an orange flag. The finishing mark is a spar buoy with a blue flag.

10 THE START

10.1 RRS 26 and Preparatory Signals in Race Signals are deleted. Races will be started using the following signals. This changes RRS 26 and Race Signals.

10.4 A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

11 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

11.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or move the finishing line) without signalling. This changes RRS 33 and AppSF 10.1.

13 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

- 13.1 The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 30 minutes to sail.
- 13.2 Time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish is 50 minutes.
- 13.3 Finishing window is 10 minutes.
